

A Message from the GM

To Our Valued Customers,

Happy New Year to all! I hope everyone had time to relax and spend time with family and friends over the past holiday season. This is my annual year in review message.

I'll tackle the biggest project first – construction of the new transmission main in Rampart Range Road. I know this project has been inconvenient for everyone, and it certainly hasn't been without its hiccups. I've heard rumors this project serves Sterling Ranch, which is not true. The old transmission main was constructed in the early 1970s and was too small to meet the community's water needs, especially for fire suppression. Replacing it was critical to meeting your water needs. We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you all for your patience.

Every year we clean and inspect one-third of the District's sewer system. We closely review the inspections and schedule repairs. In 2021 we inspected the sewer system in the Roxborough Park neighborhood, and you may notice crews working to install cast-in-place liners in the sewers with deficiencies. Taking the proactive step to install structural liners in these sewers extends their useful life and avoids costly excavations to remove and replace. There may be short-term, localized traffic control over the next few months while this work continues. This year other parts of the system were inspected, and we will repeat the same process of repairs as needed.

In 2022 the Roxborough community turned 50, which means the water and sewer infrastructure is also 50 years old. We have worked hard to identify the most critical facilities to ensure continuity of service and are carefully planning for replacement or rehabilitation. The District's existing debt service mill levy (2.0 mills) will expire in 2025 when the bonds for the sewer regionalization project are paid. Extending that small mill levy to fund aging infrastructure projects would allow the District to complete these necessary repairs without impacting rates.

Winter Tree and Landscape Watering

If temperatures are above 40 degrees and there’s no snow on the ground, watering trees can even protect them from diseases and branch dieback.

You will want to water slowly, dispersing the flow of water to get the water deep down to the trees roots. According to the experts at CSU, deep watering trees to a depth of 12” inches below the soil surface is preferred. Saturate the soil around the tree within the “dripline” (the outer edges of the tree’s branches) to disperse water down toward the roots.

For evergreens, water 3’-5’ beyond the dripline on all sides of the tree. They also recommend to not dig holes in the ground in an effort to water deeply. To do so can dry out tree roots even more. A soil needle/deep root feeder attached to a hose is acceptable to insert into the ground if your soil is not too hard and compact.

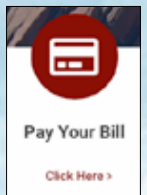
